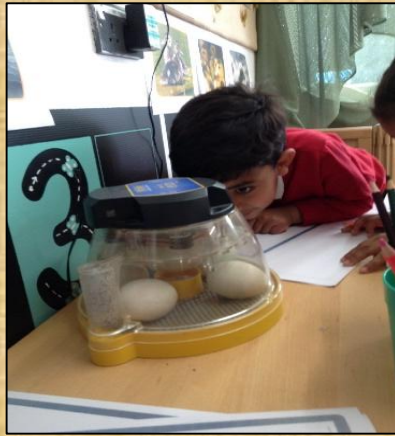
Forest School
