They got big very fast. Soon they were big enough to play in the water, they really enjoyed splashing around.



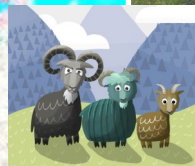
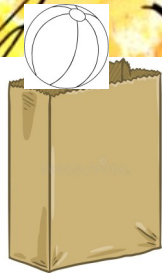
We had kind and gentle hands so we could hold or touch the ducklings.

The Giant African Land snail

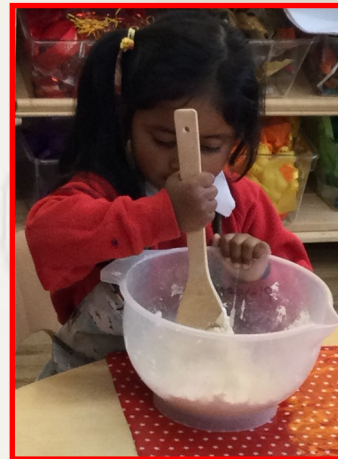
